Clifton Nurseries was established in 1871 and wins medals at Chelsea. It has good quality plants and sundries and a good café but is rather pricey.

Crews Hill Garden Centres

Cattlegate Road, Enfield, EN2

Not local but the train takes only 34 minutes. Take the mainline train from Moorgate towards Hertford North and alight at Crews Hill. Go down slope to Cattlegate Road and turn left.

There are several garden centres along both sides of Cattlegate Road, and if you turn right into Theobald's Park Road there are even more! Several nurseries have cafés, and there is also a pub.
